- Youth for Europe Europe for Youth
 For a Europe which promotes dialogue and participation opportunities for young people.
- Gender Equality Strengthening Social Cohesion across the EU

 For a Europe in which women can develop their full potential. We need good framework conditions even more in times of crisis.
- Solidarity Supporting Vulnerable Groups in our Society
 For a Europe which also tackles the challenges vulnerable groups have to face children, families with low income,
 LGBTI+ persons, senior citizens.



Europe for YOUth, YOUth for Europe – Space for democracy and participation

- Engage Youth and democracy in Europe
 Ensuring at European level that the perspectives and ideas which young people have for democratic togetherness in Europe are heard.
- Connect Mobility of young people in Europe
 Promoting communication between young people so that they become actively committed to Europe.
- Empower Youth Work in Europe
 Strengthening young people growing up through our youth work, providing European impetus for further developing youth work in Europe.





Gender Equality – Strengthening Social Cohesion across the EU

- Reducing the negative social and economic consequences of the COVID-19 pandemic for women and supporting women's economic independence
- Tackling the gender pay gap by promoting a gender equal distribution of unpaid care work (Council Conclusions)
- Ending all forms of violence against women and providing essential support services for every woman in need
- Enhancing the representation of women in leadership positions





Solidarity – Supporting Vulnerable Groups in our Society

- LGBTI+ persons: Enhancing the rights and equality of LGBTI+ persons and rainbow families (launch and debate of the LGBTI+ Strategy).
- Children and families with low income: Strengthening children and families in Europe especially in times of crisis – protecting children and combatting child and family poverty.
- Senior citizens: Supporting the rights and participation of older persons in society in the era of digitalisation (Council Conclusions).





Trio Presidency with Portugal and Slovenia

Close and continued cooperation between the Trio partners

Within the Trio presidency, we aim to build a coherent European agenda for the coming 18 months.

- Ensuring coordinated crisis management at EU level
- Learning all lessons from the crisis and tackling the socio-economic consequences
- Addressing important future challenges together

- Start of a new 18-month cycle of the EU Youth Dialogue on 1 July.
- Trio Declaration on Gender Equality to be published on 6 July.
